Comments from Pastor Chris . . .

Grace, mercy, and peace be to you from God our Father and from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

First things first, Advent began November 30. During the season, we will be having Wednesday night services at 7:00PM. This year I will be preaching on Holy Communion for these services. Christmas Eve and Christmas Day services will be held in Tower City.

Advent is a season of expectation, fasting, and preparation. Traditionally, Advent was understood to be the sister of Lent and had similar traditions concerning fasting and almsgiving. In the spirit of the season, it is fitting to make some type of devotional shift during this time. The idea is this: we remember Christ's birth and his eventual return during Advent. As such, especially considering the latter emphasis of the season, Christians have taken stock of their lives during this time. Much like the emphasis of the parable of the ten bridesmaids (Matthew 25), we should do what we can to prepare for our Lord's return. Not that any of this justifies us before God, but disciplining our flesh is always a good way to take stock of the condition sin leaves us in. In short, it helps us to know more intimately our need for Christ and his salvation.

So, if you have not done so yet, take up daily reading of the Bible, pray an extra time each day, give extra to charity; especially the poor and hungry, or undertake some other devotion. These disciplines can help focus your attention on the coming Christmas celebration and its significance. Happy Advent to you all!
