In the last few days I have heard so many reactions, encouragements, plans, hopes, dreams and instructions of how to cope and stay safe from this virus that threatens us all. Here are some snippets.

One sermon says not to fear, only believe

Encouragement to not fear- look to facts

I heard a sermon on God's provision and grace -our hope is in Him- And so it is!

Be sure we practice "Social Distance" Wow! This Sure is Fun!

Through it all, this Sermon came in my Spirit- this sermon spoke of how the people of God, known as Israel, thought the Old Testament had to be awakened to return in obedience and fellowship with their God, to seek and do His will.

One sermon continued- Is.55:8 “My thoughts are not like your thoughts nor my ways like your ways.” What are God’s ways concerning this pandemic? To the Folks of Harmony:

- May the peace of our Risen Lord be with you! Christ’s Peace is beyond all human understanding, it is a peace not of this world yet is perfect Peace. A Peace with a Message: God is with us. Christ is with His loved ones always. Be Encouraged.
- I heard this truth today that, “Thanksgiving given to God brings more blest outcomes than fear.” Thanksgiving in 1Thessalonians 5:16, “Be Joyful always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances for this is God’s will for you in Christ Jesus.
- I miss our worshipping together. I continue these communications with phone calls. “They say absence makes the heart grow fonder.”
- Our overall theme this Lent has been from Hebrews 10:22; “Let us draw near to God with a

sincere heart \_\_\_”

- Throughout the weeks we have focused on those who in one way or another have drawn near to God, many with that gift of sincere faith with sincere hearts. I recall; Blind Bartimaeus, Zacchaeus, Nicodemus, the Good Samaritan, this last Sunday the scripture focused on the man born blind.

We recall Jesus’ disciples in John 9:1-41 ”asked what the blind man’s blind condition was, because of sin or not? Jesus says not his or his parents’ sin, but that God’s might may be displayed in life. Pharisees were present and confronted the blind man and Jesus about this “healing miracle”.

There were some real pointed words given. Those teachers of Israel ignored the miracle and verbally attacked Jesus and the blind man who now sees! This paragraph is instructive, vs. 30-34 of Chapter 9. The teachers questioned where Jesus came from?

The blind man responds: “Now that is remarkable! You don’t know where He has come from, yet He opened my eyes. We know that God does not listen to sinners. He listens to the Godly man who does His will. Nobody has ever heard of opening the eyes of a blind man. If this man were not from God He could do nothing.” The Pharisees reply to the blind man’s heartfelt praise of God and Jesus - to the blind man they accuse, “you were steeped in sin at birth, how dare you lecture us, and they threw the blind man out”.

The contrast between the Pharisees and the Blind Man who now sees is instructive. The insincere Pharisees were truly blind to who Jesus was/is and the Blind Man’s sincere witness of and to Jesus showed clearly how he could now see!

- The text for last Wednesday was from Luke 17:11-19. Ten Lepers cry out to Jesus for healing; “Jesus Master have mercy on us, have pity on us”. Seeing and hearing the lepers, Jesus says, “go show yourselves to the priests”. They were being healed. Nine were healed and never came back in thanksgiving to Jesus, but one did, he praised God in a loud voice, throwing himself at Jesus’ feet, thanking Jesus! Jesus responds, were not ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? Was no one found to return and give thanks to God except this foreigner? This samaritan? Jesus said to the lone cleansed leper “Rise and go, your faith has made you well!” 10 were cleansed one returned, he was cleansed and found salvation in and through Jesus. Praise God!

(note: the lesson, the one cleansed leper’s heart was full of praise and sincere thankfulness and faith! He found saving grace in Jesus. The other nine got what they wanted and missed what they needed)

- This Sunday March 29 the text is from John 11:1-45. The text speaks of the Raising of Jesus’ friend Lazarus, brother of Mary and Martha. Word came to Jesus of Lazarus’ death. Jesus says Lazarus only sleeps, Jesus waits 4 days and arrives late. Lazarus is entombed. Jesus calls for the stone in front of the burial cave to be removed. He calls “Lazarus come out!” (having given thanks to God before the miracle). Mary and Martha, Lazarus and all present experienced the action and will of God as you and I, His children of Faith, have. “Take the grave clothes off and let him go”. The apostle John, remembering Jesus’ words, blesses us. “I am the Resurrection and the Life. He who believes in me tho he were dead yet shall he live and whoever lives and believes in me will never die - Do you believe this?” We have this hope in Christ.

Sincere hearts, faithful trust in Christ, thankful hearts even before the miracles brings amazing Grace .

- I’m praying for our Holy Week and Easter services, please pray for this with me.
