Dear Family and Friends,

Now that many of us are spending more time in our homes due to Covid 19, it may be a good time to check your home's radon level. Did you know that radon causes 21,000 deaths per year and that 2,900 of these deaths occur among individuals who have never smoked?

Radon is invisible, has no odor, and is the second leading cause of lung cancer. It comes from a breakdown from soil, rock and water. Nearly one out of every 15 homes in the US have elevated radon levels. Radon can get into your home through cracks in solid floors, construction joints, cracks in the walls, gaps in suspended floors, gaps around service pipes, cavities inside walls and well water supply.

Testing your home is easy and inexpensive. If your radon level is 4 picocuries per liter (pCi/L) or higher you should fix your home. Even levels less than 4 pCi/L still pose a risk and may be reduced.

Reducing radon can include; sealing cracks, a vent pipe system, house pressurization, heat recovery ventilator or using a high-density plastic sheet to cover open soil in a crawl space. The best way is to consult a certified contractor who specializes in radon. The cost of "Fixing" a radon problem can be similar to common household repairs.
