Comments from Pastor Thea . .

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*"God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.
Therefore we will not fear..." (Psalm 46:1-2a).*

Halloween has grown to become a profitable holiday for business income, second only to Christmas. The Christian celebration of Halloween (*All Hallows Eve*) is the church's way of honoring persecuted Christians and departed loved ones, especially martyrs, who have died for the faith.

Halloween is also remembered as the defining moment for the Lutheran Reformation as Luther posted his 95 theses on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany, on October 31, 1517. It had become the church's practice to display a large collection of supposed relics (pieces of bones from saints, locks of martyrs' hair, fragment of the true cross, twig from the burning bush, etc.) on Halloween, the day before All Saints' Day. By 1518, the exhibit had grown to 17,443 pieces in twelve aisles. The church taught that anyone viewing and venerating these relics and paying a special fee (indulgence) could reduce the time their soul would stay in purgatory. This was one of the teachings Luther challenged in his 95 theses. Luther taught that God's favor is neither bought nor earned but freely given through the merit of Jesus Christ.

As we celebrate Reformation Day, October 28th (always coming on the Sunday before Halloween), and its relationship with All Hallows Eve and All Saints' Day (coming the Sunday after Halloween), we reaffirm the place of scripture, faith and grace in the lives of Christians. We have no reason to fear the power of darkness with its random acts of violence and its unsavory influences. We have no reason to fear the wrath of God for our moral failures and personal shortcomings. We have no reason to fear any uncertainty about tomorrow. We know who holds the future and we can say with Luther, "I am standing where I've always stood—in the hands of God."

In this season of falling leaves, descending darkness, dropping temperatures, parties, pumpkins and scarecrows...remember that what makes these days truly meaningful is the fellowship of all the saints—past and present, standing together in the awesome grace of God.

Dental and Heart Health

Dear Family and Friends,

“The fathers have eaten sour grapes and the children’s teeth are set on edge.”

Jeremiah 31:29 NIV

We all want to prevent heart disease. The usual recommendations for prevention of cardiovascular disease are to lose weight if overweight, eat a healthy variety of foods, exercise regularly, and don’t smoke. There is one more that may surprise you. Research shows a correlation between gum disease and heart disease because infection can travel from the mouth to the heart muscle. Who would have thought that brushing your teeth and flossing regularly might help prevent heart disease? Some people are genetically more prone to gum disease, but everyone can be vigilant in keeping their mouths healthy. Healthy gums are pink, firm and elastic. Conditions of the mouth that may be related to heart disease include:

- Gingivitis: bacteria builds up around gaps between gums and teeth and causes mild symptoms of redness, swelling and sometimes bleeding.
- Periodontitis: advanced gum disease where infection goes deeper. Toxins from bacteria are released that cause pockets to form between teeth and gums. Eventually this can cause damage to the bone that supports teeth. Gums recede from the teeth and bleeding is common.
- Cavities, abscesses, missing teeth: mouth problems that can lead to inflammation and possible heart disease.

Some medications can cause dry mouth that can lead to gum disease. Illnesses like diabetes or arthritis can also affect the immune system causing gum problems. These need to be discussed with the doctor and dentist to find a solution.

Prevention is the key. Brush your teeth twice a day and floss at least once a day. Brushing should be in a circular motion. Back and forth brushing can actually cause damage to the gums. Flossing also needs to be done properly to be effective. At your next visit check with the hygienist or dentist to be sure that your technique is correct. Visits for cleaning and checkups should be at least every six months. Anyone with existing gum problems will need more frequent cleanings. Caring for your teeth and gums takes little time when you consider the benefit it may give your heart.
